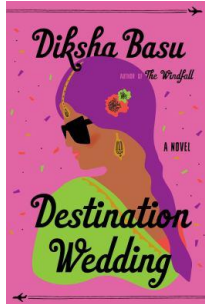

Destination Wedding

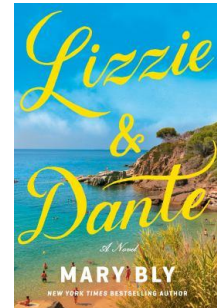

The Guncle

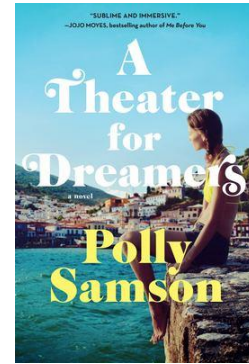

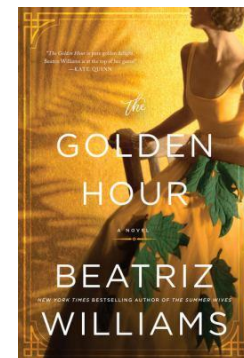

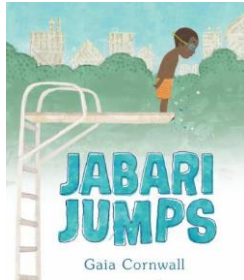
The Golden Hour

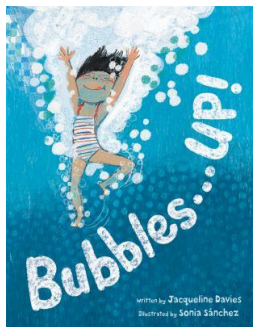
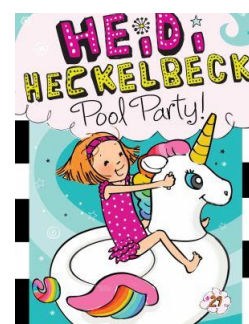

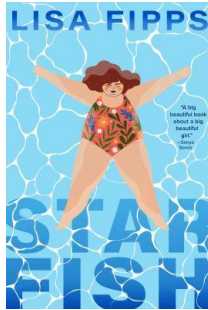

Starfish

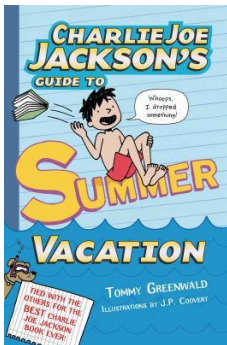

Charlie Joe Jackson's Guide to Summer Vacation

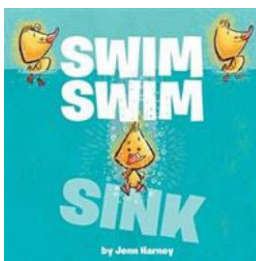
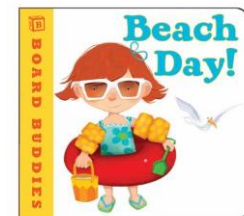
