## Suzanne Simard on the Social Life of Forests [REGISTER](#)

Join us for an illuminating evening with forest ecologist Suzanne Simard on the day of the paperback release of her book, *Finding the Mother Tree: Discovering the Wisdom of the Forest*.

In her book, Dr. Simard reveals forests as not simply the source of timber or pulp, but as complex, interdependent circles of life. Her work has shown us that forests are social entities that communicate their vitality and vulnerabilities through underground networks. Trees perceive one another, learn and adapt their behaviors, recognize neighbors, and remember the past. They elicit warnings and mount defenses. They compete and cooperate. At the center are the mother trees that connect and sustain the community.

A pioneer on the frontier of plant communication and intelligence, Dr. Simard is a professor of forest ecology at the University of British Columbia. Her work has influenced filmmakers (the Tree of Souls in James Cameron's *Avatar*) and her TED talks have been viewed by more than 10 million people worldwide.
