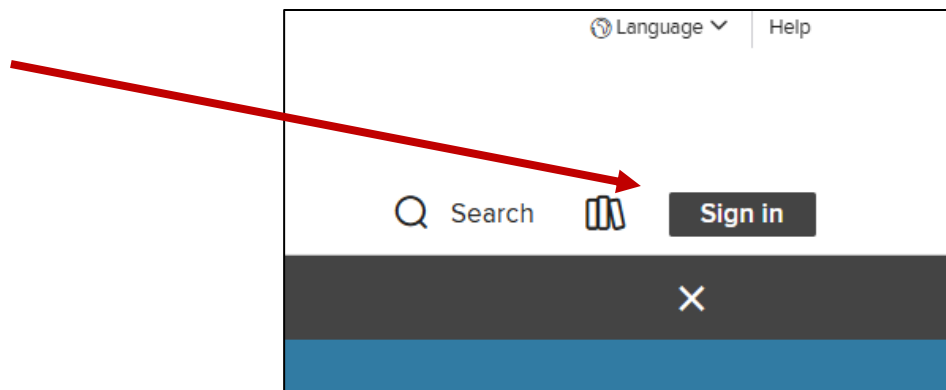
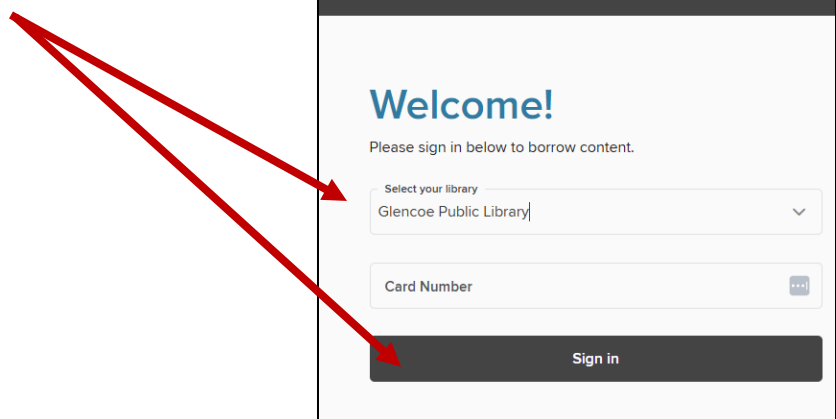


Access a world of free reading materials with your Glencoe Library card. Glencoe Public Library is part of the Digital Library of Illinois (DLIL), a consortium that purchases e-books, e-audiobooks, and digital magazines for residents of Illinois. To begin reading a book, listen to an audiobook, or view a magazine, visit the DLIL website at <https://dlil.overdrive.com/> in your browser. Follow the instructions below to sign in to DLIL. Please note, DLIL titles are not “on demand” – DLIL libraries purchase each digital book or audiobook individually. This means you may need to place a hold on high-demand titles. To begin, visit <https://dlil.overdrive.com/> in any Internet browser.

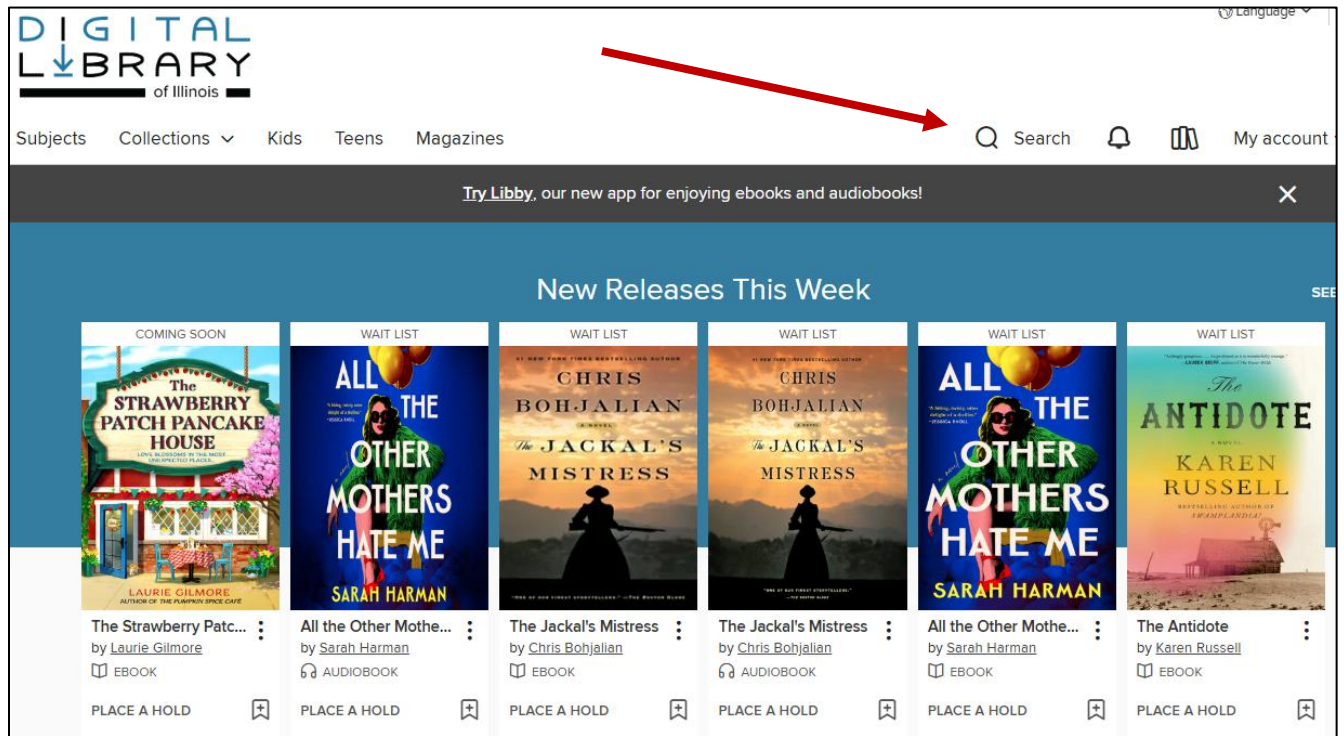
- 1) On the DLIL website, click the “Sign In” button in the upper right corner of the screen.



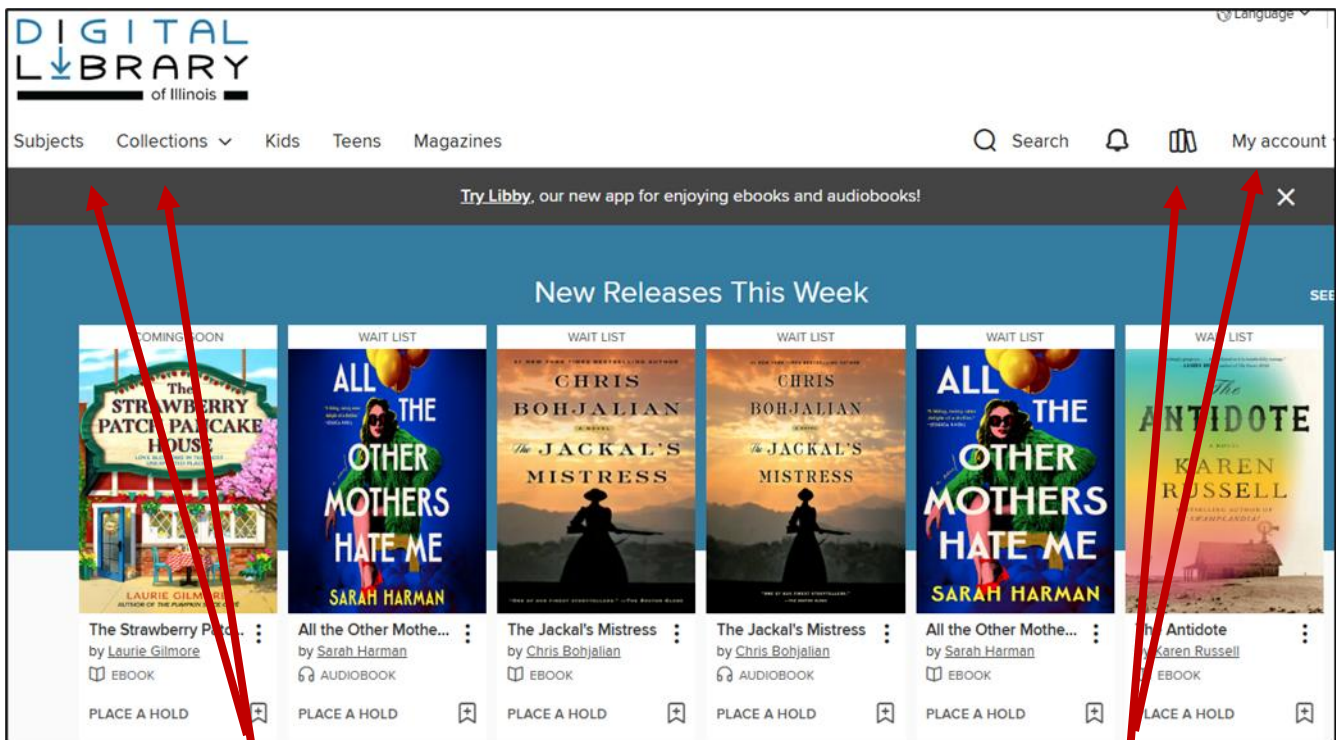
- 2) On the next screen, select “Glencoe Public Library” from the drop-down menu, then enter your library card number in the field provided and click “Sign In.”



- 3) Welcome to the DLIL home page! Search for books, audiobooks, and magazines by clicking the magnifying glass, or scroll down the page to browse popular titles.



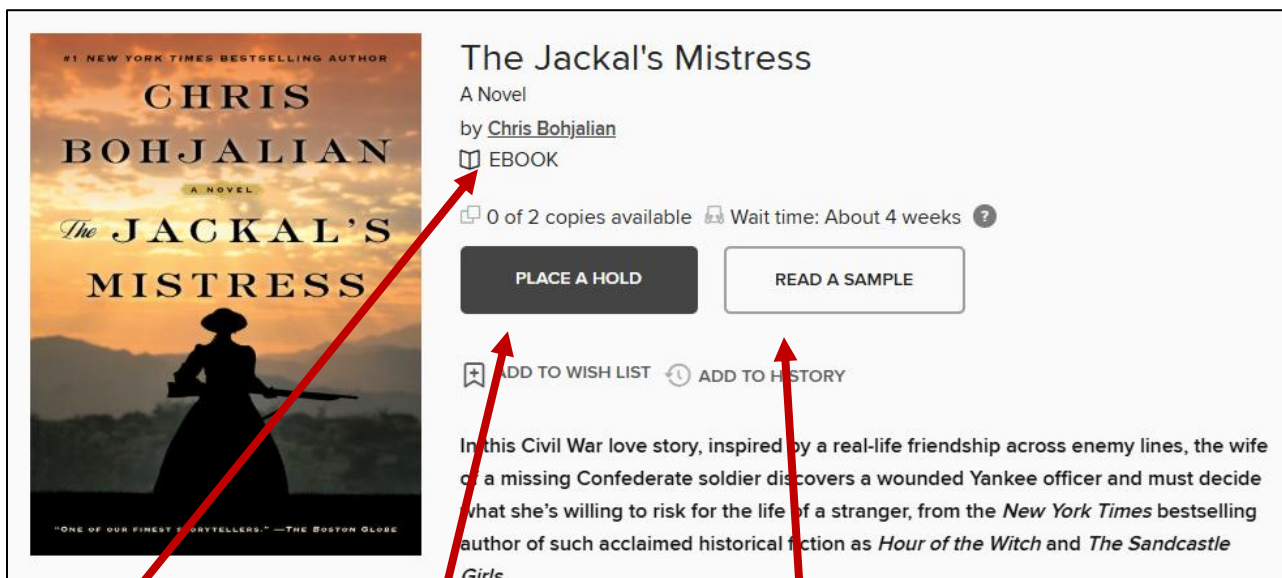
- 4) Access your account information and bookshelf (items you have checked out) at the top right side of the screen. To open an item from your Bookshelf, click the bookshelf icon and then click "Read Now In Browser" next to the title.

- 5) Below the author's name in each item listing, books will say "Ebook" and audiobooks will say "Audiobook." Checked out items will say "Place A Hold" in the item listing; if the item is available, it will say "Borrow." Click "Place A Hold" to hold an item, and to borrow an item, click "Borrow." Clicking the cover art of the item will open the full item record with a summary and sample page. Hold or borrow items from this screen, as well.

- 6) Click "Place A Hold" and enter your email address (twice) in the pop-up window. When the item becomes available, it will check out to you automatically and you will receive an email notification. Go to DLIL and check your Bookshelf to view the item (remember, your Bookshelf is at the top right side of the screen and looks like a stack of books).

7) To borrow an item, click “Borrow.”



She and Rochester fall passionately in love, in one of the great literary love stories. But a dark secret in his house will tear them apart and send her alone into the wilderness before she can find her way back to him.

8) A pop-up window will appear, with a drop-down arrow next to “Borrow for” – select your loan period, then click “Borrow.” Avid readers often prefer a shorter check-out time, but items are available for up to 21 days. Renew any item with no holds. Glencoe patrons can borrow up to ten items at one time and return borrowed items at any time.

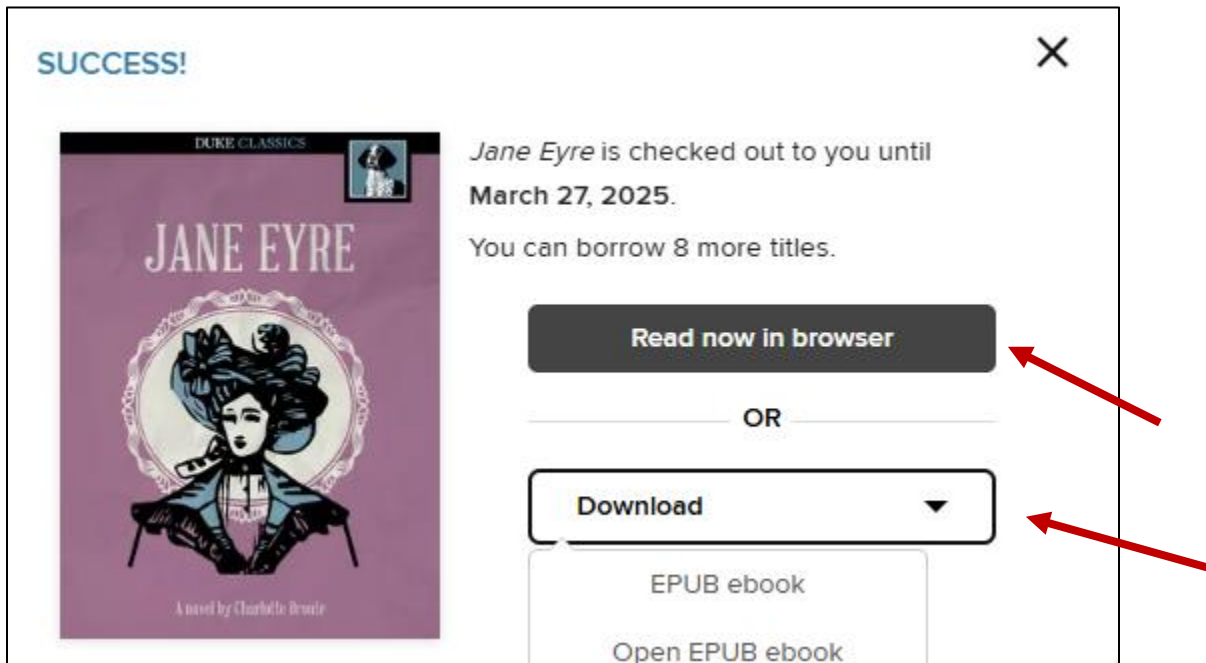

- 9) After selecting a checkout period and clicking “Borrow,” a new pop-up window will appear. Select how you would like to read or listen to your item – read it in the browser or download the book to your computer as an EPub or Open EPub book. Either format opens easily on most computers. User cannot download e-audiobooks from the DLIL website but can listen to them in the browser (download these titles in the Libby app, instead – see our Libby instructions).



- 10) To access your borrowed items, always go to <https://dlil.overdrive.com/> and open your items from your Bookshelf. Remember, your Bookshelf is the book stack icon at the top right side of the DLIL page.
